

Johnny has explored the subject through the work of artists and poets through history together with Bible readings and prayer and it has been interesting to see how Jesus's journey to the cross has been portrayed by different artists over the centuries. This painting shows Peter's denial of Jesus (Mark 14:69-72). The crowing cock is in the centre of the picture. Jesus and the women on the steps are both looking at Peter for different reasons and he turns his head away. This was accompanied by the poem 'The Look' by Elizabeth Barrett Browning which you can find on the internet. The two questions we were asked were: "How do you think Peter felt?" and "Have you ever allowed fear to get in the way of trusting God wholeheartedly?" It was the resurrected Jesus who forgave Peter and challenged him with "Feed my sheep". Jesus never gives up on us - there is always the opportunity of forgiveness and a new start. Can we, as individuals and as a church, the body of Christ, rise to the challenges we are presented with? Please pray.

In reflection on the message from Sunday 20th March 2022

Call to Worship: Psalm 107, v1-9, Give thanks to the LORD.

Extracts from Bible Reading from Isaiah 60, v19-21: **Everlasting Light.** v19f: **The sun will no more be your light by day,...** 

for the Lord will be your everlasting light...your God will be your Glory...

The Lord will be your everlasting light and your days of sorrow will end.

v21: Then all your people will be righteous...they will possess the land for ever.

Extracts from John's Gospel 1, v1-14: **The Word Became Flesh.** v1: **In the beginning was the Word.** 

And the Word was with God, and the Word was God v2f: He was with God in the beginning...Through Him all things were made.

v 4: In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind.

v5: The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

v6f: There was a man sent from God whose name was John. He came as a witness

to testify concerning that light, so that through him all might believe. v9: The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world.

v10: He was in the world...but the world did not recognise him.

v12: Yet to all who did receive him...he gave the right to become children of God.

v14: The Word became Flesh and made his dwelling among us.

Sermon: What makes us to be church – part 3, continuing how the old-testament Tabernacle ("church") at the centre of the community ("Borough") served the people as the dwelling place of God -The Everlasting Light – God's light shining on us. In the Christian world, God's light comes through Jesus, giving the right of all, to become Children of

God, forming a Royal Priesthood of Believers in God's Covenants. We joined together in Communion.

In reflection on the message from Sunday 27th March 2022

Extracts from Luke's Gospel 15, v1-3 & v11b-32: **The Parable of the Lost Son**.

v1-3: Now the tax collectors and sinners were all gathered around to hear Jesus.

But the Pharisees and the teachers of the law muttered, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them."

But Jesus told them this Parable.

v11b: "There was a man who had two sons.

v12f: The younger one said to his father, '...Give me my share of the estate.'

So he divided his property between them. Not long after that, the younger son got together all he had, set off for a distant country and

there squandered his wealth in wild living.

...He began to be in need...and hired himself out...to feed pigs.

v16: He longed to fill his stomach with the pods the pigs were eating.

v17f: When he came to his senses he said...'I will go back to my father,

and say to him: Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you.

v19: I am no longer worthy to be called your son.'


So, humbly, he went back to his father,

but his father was filled with compassion and welcomed his return with a celebration.

v24: 'For this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found.'

v25f: Meanwhile, the elder son...became angry. So his father said to him...

v31f: 'My son...you are always with me, and all that I have is yours. We had to celebrate and be glad...this brother of yours...was lost and is found.'

In reflection on the message from Sunday 3rd April 2022

Extracts from Hebrews 10, v19-25: A Call to Persevere in Faith. v19f: Therefore, brothers and sisters, since we have confidence to enter the Holy Place

by the blood of Jesus, by a new and living way opened for us through the curtain,

that is, his body, and since we have a great priest over the house of God,

let us draw near to God with a sincere heart and with the full assurance that faith brings, having our hearts sprinkled to cleanse us from a guilty conscience

and having our bodies washed with pure water.

v23: Let hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful.

v24f: And let us consider how we may spur one another towards love and good deeds,

not giving up meeting together...but encouraging one another – and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

Sermon: What makes us to be Church 4, continuing, about the OT-Tabernacle, describing how The Holy of Holies was hidden behind The Curtain, which separates the 'public' area from God's area, the priest's domain. The Hebrews are being told, in chapter 10 that "Jesus...opened for us...the curtain, that is, his body ..." Alluding to Jesus death (e.g. Matthew 27, v51f) when "the curtain of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom...and the tombs broke open..." Resurrection, which the Cross made available to all

In reflection on the message from Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> April 2022 Call to worship from Psalm 118, with responses.

Extracts from Luke's Gospel 19, v 28-40: **Jesus Comes to Jerusalem as King**.

v28f: Jesus went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. As he approached

Bethphage and Bethany at the hill called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, "Go to the village ahead of you,

and as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ridden.

Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?'

Say, 'The Lord needs it'"

v35f: They brought it to Jesus, threw their cloaks on it and put Jesus on it.

As he went along, people spread their cloaks on the road.

v37: When he came near the place where the road goes down the Mount of Olives,

the whole crowd of disciples began joyfully to praise God in loud voices.

v38: "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!"
"Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!"

v39: Pharisees in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, rebuke your disciples!"

v40: "I tell you," he replied, "If they keep quiet, the stones will cry out."

Talk: What Shall We Shout About? All God's Good Gifts. Hallelujah! All Four Gospels tell the story of Palm Sunday, the start of the journey to the Cross and Easter Sunday. The Resurrection of Jesus promises believers the Gift of Eternal Life.
