Prayers for week beginning September 11th 2023

Recently it has been suggested during Morning Worship that we should share our faith, tell our story. In other words, talk to people. Our prayers remind us of some of the people Jesus spoke to and what He said.

Monday 11th

¹⁹“Come, follow me,” Jesus said, “and I will make you fishers of men.” ⁰At once they left their nets and followed him.

Pray for the people we know who we can invite to become fishers of men. Pray for people we know or meet that they consider walking in the way Jesus walked?

Tuesday 12th

“Little girl, I say to you, get up!” ⁴²Immediately the girl stood up and walked around (she was twelve years old).

Pray for the Children in your family, for those who belong to our Church. Pray for those being abused or neglected. For those sick or in hospital.

Wednesday 13th

³⁴He said to her, “Daughter, your faith has healed you. Go in peace and be freed from your suffering.”

Pray for the adults in your family, who are ill at this time, pray for those on our prayer list, people in our neighbourhood.

Thursday 14th

“Martha, Martha” the Lord answered, “you are worried and upset about many things, ⁴²but only one thing is needed. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her.”

Pray for those you know who have a deep faith and often sit at the feet of Jesus. Pray for those who work very hard in the Church. For all those you know who work very hard caring for the elderly and/or sick.

Friday 15th

When evening came, Jesus was reclining at the table with the Twelve. ²¹And while they were eating, he said, “I tell you the truth, one of you will betray me.”

They were very sad and began to say to him one after the other, “Surely not I, Lord?”

Do you know anyone who deliberately disowns Jesus? Pray for them

Saturday 16th

There are lots of people mentioned in the Bible, people who Jesus spoke to. Pray for all those who are seeking Jesus. Are they waiting for you to tell them about Jesus and His love for you?

Sunday 17th

What has Jesus said to you? A big question. Is he asking you do something different. Think about it and ask Him to ask you again.
