As we go to press our beloved minister, Reverend Andrew Mudharara, is away for a few weeks visiting the country of his birth and taking a well-earned rest from his ministry duties.

Our minister is further afield in Zimbabwe of course, but due to the blessing of our youngest daughter's 21st and the sadness of a family funeral, my wife & I had to travel between Yorkshire & the East Midlands a number of times recently. It led to me to contemplate how I would describe myself to others when asked where I am from. Would I call myself a "Midlander", though only having lived here a short time, or would I call myself an "exiled Yorkshireman". This lends itself to the cliché that "You can take the person out of Yorkshire, but you can never take the Yorkshire out of the person".

Is it important to acknowledge where we are from? Well God believes it is as many times we are told where figures are from in the Bible and how a geographical location can sometimes determine some of the character of a person.

This even related to Jesus, known as the Nazarene. Born in Bethlehem and exiled as a baby. Whether projected or real, even Jesus was tainted with regional prejudice.

"Nazareth! Can anything good come from there?" Nathanael asked.

"Come and see," said Philip.

Having a sense of identity of where we are born or raised can undeniably have an affect on us, though if we are Christians our true identity lies in being citizens of the Kingdom of Heaven.

There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus

Political borders may use geographical features to mark a territory, but many times mankind has decided upon an imaginary line on a map.

God does not recognise political borders. Look how quickly covid spread without acknowledgement of border control. When dawn breaks, the rays of sunshine do not have to clear passport control in each country.

A recent visit to Tennessee reminded me that I had far more values and character traits in common with those I was staying with than others, who do not believe in Jesus, that I had grown up with in my own hometown.



The ramifications of these verses carry far more significance than our fellowship with other followers of Christ in our church, our community or around the world.

In a world tearing itself apart in conflict, it is important we challenge the narratives we are fed by the worldly media. As Christians we are always going to feel a spiritual affinity with Israel, but how do we square that up with the Christian community suffering in Palestine? Are they not our brothers & sisters in Christ? There are many that love the Lord in the Ukraine, but are there not many that love the Lord in Russia too?

As followers of Christ, we are called to look beyond the political world, beyond the physical world and look at all situations with a spiritual view point.

We should not condemn a whole nation or people because of the actions of its leaders, however unjust their actions. One of the most respected theologians of the twentieth century, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, was a German and wrote his most Spirit-inspired work during the Nazi regime. The darkness of man's sinful heart can never extinguish God's light. No regime born of man can ever carry more authority than God.



Despite what we are fed by the media, the world cannot be divided into "good guys" & the "bad guys", like some 1950s B-movie western.

As citizens of the Kingdom of Heaven, our love should cross all borders. As we pray for those suffering hunger & the threat of shell fire in Gaza, we should also pray for those Israeli families suffering loss and uncertainty for their kidnapped loved ones.

The challenge for Christians is to put aside the political narrative by looking at every conflict with an eternal vision and, regardless of race or nationality, pray for all those in danger & suffering the consequences of mankind's eagerness to subjugate others.
