ORGAN RECITAL On Saturday 18th May, David Saint, Organist and Director of Music at St Chad's Cathedral, Birmingham, gave a recital on our venerable organ. David described playing it as "like driving a vintage car"! David's programme was well-suited to the organ, and although mainly from 19th and early 20th century, it nonetheless demonstrated a range of musical styles.

We experienced his skill and fine musicianship with some particularly nimble pedal work in a Mendelssohn sonata. There was a good attendance, and an encouraging number of visitors. We are grateful for a generous donation from the Leicester and District Organists' Association to help with the costs. We hope to arrange some more recitals in the future.

Minister's Letter

Greetings to you in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Tavonga (my daughter) and myself had a good time in Zimbabwe meeting family and friends. It was a happy learning experience for both us. We travelled well thanks be to God. We were glad to be back and be with Candid.

Pentecost is a significant time in the calendar of the Church as it reminds us about the promise that Jesus promised to His disciples when he said "if you love me, keep my commands. And I will ask the Father, and He will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever- the Spirit of truth... I will not leave you as orphans, I will come to you" (John 14:15-18). The promise of the Holy Spirit was poured out upon the disciples on the day of Pentecost. The promise of the Holy Spirit "is for you (the people Peter was talking to) and your children (next generation) and for all who are far offfor all whom the Lord our God will call" (Acts 2:15). We are included in the promise as the children of those present during Peter's sermon and also as those far off and those whom God called. The promise is for us to take and enjoy.

The Holy Spirit was given to us to comfort us and support us (John 14:160 as we serve in the Kingdom of our God and to teach us (John 14:26).

Jesus told the disciples to wait in Jerusalem until they were filled with the Holy Spirit "when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem (local area) and in all Judea and Samaria (next town and villages) and to the ends of the earth ". We were given the Holy Spirit to help us reach out to the people around us and far off with the gospel.



From Independent Chapel to Hinckley United Reformed Church

The origin of the Hinckley United Reformed Church goes back to the founding Independent of an congregation in Hinckley after the Great Ejection of 1662. Reverend Thomas Leadbetter, and some of his congregation, left St Mary's parish church in 1662 and began to worship secretly in Woods. Burbage Later. this congregation met in a barn in the town, possibly in Bond End (now Bond Street) where there were many farms.

An *Inquiry Concerning*Conventicles , ordered by

Archbishop Sheldon in 1669,
reported that there was in Hinckley

One conventicle of Presbiterians usually held on every Sunday in the afternoon at the dwelling house of Samuel Ward theire numbers about twenty Mr. Nathaniel Stevens formerly minister of ffeney draiton now ejected being theire preacher consisting of an ordinary sort of people ...



The Academy and Parsonage

After the Act of Indulgence of 1672 granted freedom of worship to the non-conformists the house belonging to the hosier Samuel Ward was licensed as a meeting house in May 1672

At this time the connection of the Presbyterians and Independents was very close and in Hinckley the two denominations remained on friendly terms worshipping together.

Two small cottages were bought around 1698 and converted into a meeting house, and "on January 26, 1720, a parcel of ground" was bought for £222.2s, later to be the site of the Great Meeting.

The John Jennings, Reverend junior, a Congregationalist, came to Hinckley in 1720 to minister to the local congregation, and he also founded Academy an for the training of ministers the near meeting house.
