Prayers 10th June – 16th June

<u>Mon 10th June</u> Lord Jesus, servant of all, come to us and grant us the light of your presence, for we are weak and poor in faith, slow to follow and swift to stray. Though we yearn to be your people, day after day we let you down. Though we hunger to serve you better, time and again we serve only ourselves. Teach us to put you at the centre of our lives.

<u>**Tues 11th June</u>** In all the stress and rush of life it is so easy to forget you and to lose our way. In the press of each day, we allow you to be crowded out, preoccupied instead with our own problems and concerned with our own plans and needs.
