Parent Circle Families Forum

The conflict in the Middle East is escalating and very concerning for all of us. Tony and I learnt about this group on the breakfast news recently. I guess some of you already know about it. If you have access to the internet you can find more information by putting in the title of the group in the search box. This is an interfaith organisation – people who have lost children and other family members on both sides of the conflict have joined together - and as Christians we can play our part by continuing to pray for peace and for the success of the forum.

The PCFF members are opposed to the occupation and believe that it is possible to end the conflict. They wish to influence the public and the political decision makers to choose reconciliation and the path of peace over violence and war

The PCCF vision is

To work towards an end to violence and towards achieving an accepted political agreement

- To create a framework for a reconciliation between the 2 people that takes into account that any political peace agreement must include an infrastructure for the process of reconciliation.
- To work towards an end to violence and towards achieving an accepted political agreement.
- To influence the public and the political decision makers to choose reconciliation and the path of peace over violence and war in order to achieve a just settlement based on empathy and understanding.
- To avoid the use of bereavement for further violence and retribution.
- Bereaved PCFF members are opposed to the Occupation and believe that attaining historical reconciliation between the nations is a prerequisite for turning a future peace treaty into sustainable Peace.
- The Parents Circle Families Forum invites anyone who has lost a family member due to the conflict, to join us. Together, we will work to prevent more bereavement, and to promote dialogue, tolerance, reconciliation and peace.




Minister (Rev. Gordon Baker) and guests at rededication of the sanctuary.

The upstairs hall was used for worship during the renovation of the sanctuary.


